## FOREWORD

BIRDS ARE FAMILIAR, FASCINATING AND COLOURFUL CREATURES AND HAVE ATTRACTED THE ATTENTION OF MANY. BIRD SURVEYS ARE NOT ONLY GREAT FUN TO TAKE PART IN, BUT ACTS AS A MANAGEMENT TOOL FOR UNDERSTANDING THE MIGRATION PATTERN, OCCUPANCY, ROOSTING, FEEDING AND HATCHING PATTERNS AND THEREBY HELP DEVELOP AND DECISION MAKING PROCESS FOR LONG TERM SURVIVAL OF THE SPECIES.

ALL THE SURVEY CARRIED OUT IN THE CALENDAR YEAR 2021 USED THE EBIRD APPLICATION. USE OF EBIRD MOBILE APP MAKES IT EASY TO RECORD THE BIRDS ONE SEES IN THE FIELD, WHILE MAKING THE DATA OPENLY AVAILABLE FOR SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH, EDUCATION, AWARENESS AND CONSERVATION. INVOLVING THE LOCALS FOR SUCH BIRD SURVEYS HAS BEEN THE HIGH POINT IN SPREADING THE MESSAGE AND EXTENDING THE CHAIN OF VOLUNTEERS.

MOBILISING THE BIRDERS IN THE LOCALITY SERVES AS A WIN-WIN SITUATION, BOTH FOR THE VOLUNTEERS AND THE FOREST DEPARTMENT. VOLUNTEERS GET AN OPPORTUNITY TO MOVE ALONG THE DIFFERENT LANDSCAPES IN THE FOREST AND FULFIL THE PASSION OF BIRD WATCHING. ON THE OTHER HAND, IT HAS BEEN A LEARNING LESSON FOR THE FOREST DEPARTMENT TO IMBIBE THE QUALITIES OF A BIRDER AND HELP FORMULATE A MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR LONG TERM SURVIVAL OF THE AVIAN FAUNA BASED ON THE PERIODIC OBSERVATIONS.

MOST OF THE VOLUNTEERS ARE NOW A PART OF OUR CONSERVATION AWARENESS PROGRAMS AND ACTING AS MASTER TRAINERS IN THE ANUBHUTI PROGRAM, WHEREBY THEY ACCOMPANY THE SCHOOL KIDS THROUGH THE FOREST PATCHES AND HELP THEM UNDERSTAND THE ECOLOGICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND THE NEED TO CONSERVE THEM ETHICALLY FOR SHAPING THE MOTHER EARTH A PLACE TO LIVE IN.

I THANK ALL THE VOLUNTEERS WHO HAVE TAKEN PART IN ALL THE FIVE BIRD SURVEY CONDUCTED IN 2021. SPECIAL THANKS TO THE CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS SMALL PIECE OF COMPILATION WORK, BE. IT WITH SUBMISSION OF PHOTOGRAPHS OR WITH THE CONTENT WRITING. THE CONTRIBUTION OF THE TEAM OF WILD WARRIORS DESERVES A SPECIAL MENTION.
